Youth & Water
Education!**

Overview

For two days, yellow school busses roll through the autumn painted landscape of the Haliburton Highlands bringing hundreds of children to learn about one of our most valuable natural resources, water. Nestled amongst the brilliant coloured forests with a lake and wetland, the Kinark Outdoor Centre becomes a unique outdoor classroom where elementary students explore the diversity of water and come to understand its importance. Children laugh and run, visiting 40-50 interactive hands-on activity stations where they learn about water, all the while making ecological connections to the natural environment they are enjoying. The Haliburton-Muskoka-Kawartha Children's Water Festival complements the Ontario curriculum and provides children with a unique outdoor experience allowing them to make a connection to their natural world, laying the foundation for good water stewardship.



The Haliburton-Muskoka-Kawartha Children's Water Festival (HMK Children's Water Festival) has been offering this unique festival without charge since 2005. Please help us develop and sustain this important opportunity for our children and communities.

Background

Educating communities and particularly children about the importance of healthy water and water systems lays the foundation for good water stewardship. The best long term strategy to protect valuable resources such as water is to ensure that children understand its importance. When children and people in general, understand their connection to these systems and realize their ability to affect conditions of water they then want to share that knowledge with others and take care of it. Children themselves become good water stewards and not only spread messages about the vitality of water but also take control of the future of this essential natural resource. Good water stewardship values are spread throughout communities to the young and old alike. The insurance of a long term environmental benefit lies in the education that the HMK Children's Water Festival is providing. This is an invitation to be a partner in youth and water education!

The Haliburton-Muskoka-Kawartha Children's Water Festival is a fun filled experiential educational event free to students from the Trillium Lakelands District School Board (TLDSB) area. The TLDSB covers a large geographic area, approximately 11,500 Km², encompassing Haliburton County, the Regional District of Muskoka and the City of Kawartha Lakes.

The HMK Children's Water Festival brings together the expertise of educators, water quality and quantity specialists, community volunteers, Trent University students, conservation groups, industry and government to provide elementary students the opportunity to explore many different facets of





water. Attending the HMK Children's Water Festival and learning in such a fun and interactive way not only complements classroom lessons and helps teachers fulfill Ontario's school curriculum expectations but also excites and motivates students to share information that they acquire with others, causing a ripple effect. Through this experience, participating students come to understand that their attitude towards water does matter and that their actions do make a difference and, ultimately, we are all responsible for maintaining healthy water systems for healthy living.

The Haliburton-Muskoka-Kawartha Children's Water Festival was established in 2004 under the aegis of the Haliburton Highlands Outdoor Association (HHOA) with the support of the Ontario Trillium Foundation. In 2008, the HHOA decided that the HMK Children's Water Festival was beyond their mandate and the determined steering committee lost no time in finding a new home under the charitable organization, Friends of Ecological and Environmental Learning (FEEL). In 2011, "Kawartha" was incorporated within the name of the festival in order to better represent all areas whose children benefit from the messages learned at the water festival.



The Haliburton-Muskoka-Kawartha Children's Water Festival has changed its format over the years, going from a three day event (2005 – 2007) to a two day event (2008 to present) and reducing its academic focus from a grades 3-6 range (2005 – 2007) to grade 4 and grade 6 (2008 to present), to increase the overall quality of the event by narrowing the curriculum focus and reducing repetitiveness for returning students. Since 2005, the festival has hosted an annual average of 487 students every day with an overall increase in participation since 2010. 2014 and 2016 marked the highest participation with an average of 620 students from grades 2 through to grade 6 taking part each day. In 2016, for the first time, it was necessary to establish a waiting list which included 23 classes. The high registration numbers and the need for a waiting list, is an indication that teachers value the learning experience their students receive at this event.

Through a long existing partnership with Trent University and facilitation by U-Links for Community Based Research, students from the first year Environmental and Resource Studies Program can volunteer at the HMK Children's Water Festival for part of their course.

In 2016, a new partnership with Fleming College in Lindsay was initiated and 25 students helped deliver the activity stations at the HMK Children's Water Festival as part of their Outdoor Instructional Skills Course.

Outside Presenters are those organizations that donate staff, resources and time to provide activity stations and/or hands on demonstrations at the HMK Children's Water Festival. The expertise of these contributors increases the overall quality and diversity of water education available to the children at the festival. Fifteen to twenty activity stations are provided annually by Outside Presenters.
