Why Support the HMK Children's Water Festival?

Educational Excellence and Reach

Since 2005, the HMK Children's Water Festival provides experiential, hands-on learning for elementary age students. Through engaging activities focused on water conservation, watershed protection, and sustainability, children develop critical knowledge and leadership skills.

Addressing the Urgent Need for Environmental Education

The climate crisis, pollution, and resource depletion are urgent challenges. Our festival programs equip children with actionable knowledge to tackle these issues and foster a deep connection to nature that translates into sustainable behaviours.

For example, the 'Up on the Watershed' activity station (pictured to the right) offers hands-on learning about the vital role of wetlands as natural "sponges" in our watersheds. Wetlands absorb excess surface water, reducing the risk of climate-related flooding. Protecting and restoring wetlands is essential not only for flood mitigation but also for addressing biodiversity loss and fostering climate resilience, helping to alleviate climate anxiety in young learners.

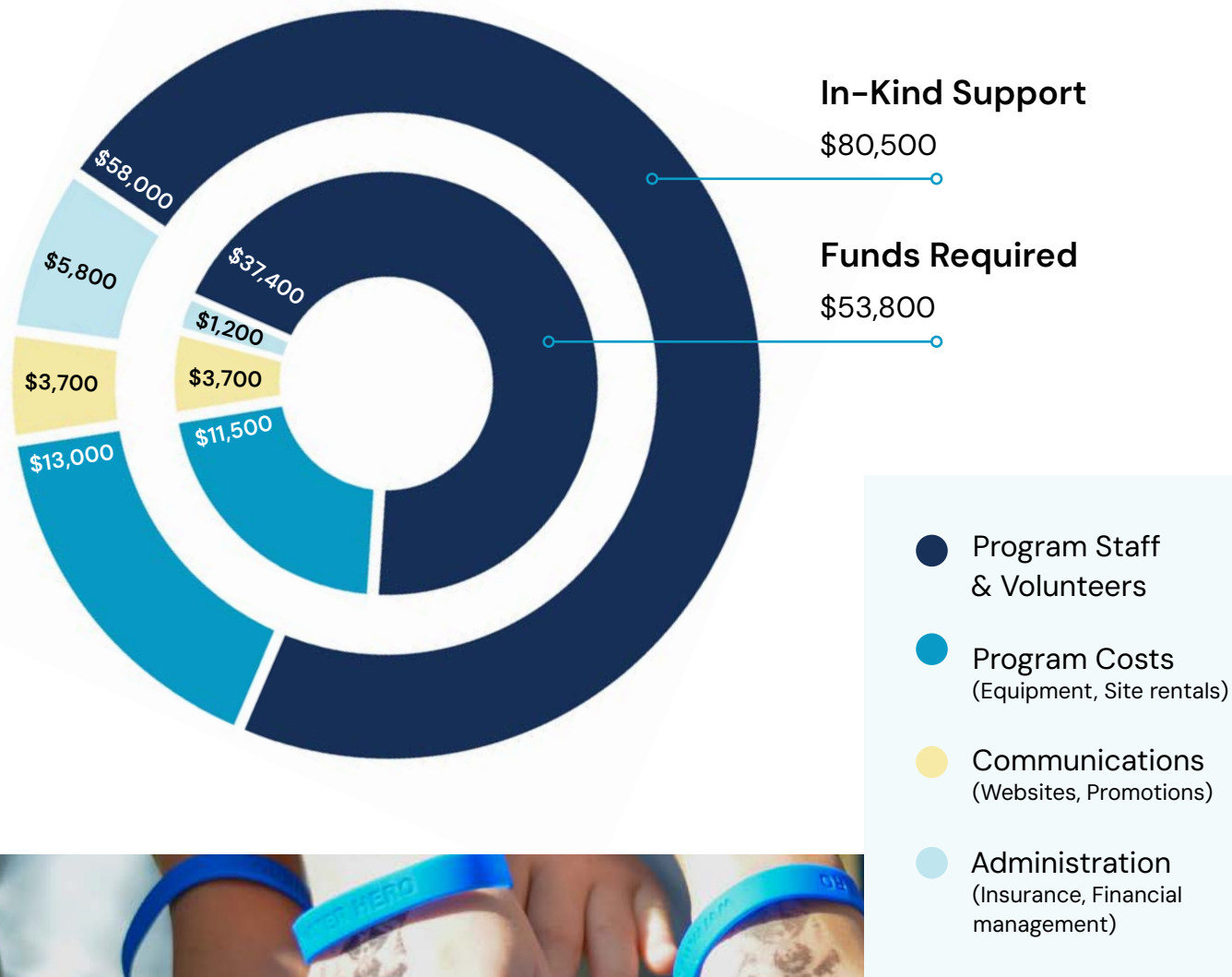
